INTRODUCTION

In 2022 culinary professionals across South Dakota responded to the SD Specialty Producers Association's (SDSPA) survey inquiring about their interest and experience in purchasing and sourcing local specialty crops.

WHAT ARE SPECIALTY CROPS?


As defined by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), specialty crops are fruits, vegetables, tree nuts, culinary herbs & spices medicinal plants, nursery crops, floriculture, and horticulture crops. Specialty crops are not commodity crops such as corn and soybeans.

CONNECTING WITH LOCAL PRODUCERS

Culinary professionals reported connecting with specialty crop producers through farmers markets, personal connections, and the internet. **28%** of respondents had used the SDSPA website to connect with local specialty crop producers.

INTEREST IN PURCHASING LOCAL SPECIALTY CROPS

Culinary professionals intentions to purchase local specialty crops in the past three years.



57% of respondents stated their interest and intention in purchasing local specialty crops has increased over the past three years.
